## **COVID-19 Daily Briefing Report**

### **City of Post Falls Updates:**

---

- Kit is continuing to work with department to place messages on Facebook and the webpage regarding remote access to City services.
- Legal is continuing to work on Open Meeting regulations with the Attorney General's Office.
- The Urban Renewal Agency met this morning and they have cancelled their April workshop and are looking at virtual meeting options for future meetings if commission members are not able to attend or if regulations are such that they are not able to meet in person. Their Legal is reviewing their options.
- Department Heads are meeting at 2pm to discuss the Federal Aid Package H.R. 6201 and its effects on leave for employees affected by COVID-19. New policies and protocols will be drafted to comply with CDC and PHD guidelines and H.R. 6201 regulations. Once complete, these policies and protocols will be shared on the SharePoint Homepage and sent out with the daily briefing.

### National Updates:

- The Senate passed H.R. 6201 – The Families First Coronavirus Response Act yesterday. This mandates employer to sick leave requirements for employees for 12 weeks (first two weeks may be unpaid). Under this current bill, the City is held to providing the leave but is not eligible for the payroll tax credits to help with funding the leave. The National League of Cities and other organizations are seeking to remedy this difference in the second stimulus bill Congress is drafting.
