- Department Heads will continue to operate under the new orders from the Governor's office in a similar manner to the prior 21-day Stay-Home order. The PD will follow the new orders for non-essential businesses as outlined in the new order. The Parks Department is evaluating the possibility of opening a few of the bathrooms following CDC guidelines for Parks. Any changes to status of the bathrooms will be communicated during the daily briefings.
