## **COVID-19 Daily Briefing Report**

### **City of Post Falls Updates:**

---

- There was a reported Garage/Yard Sale this weekend in Post Falls. The PD did go by and did not witness any regulations being broken. The sale was advertised on social media as a social distancing yard sale.
- The Bunker Bar was closed down from serving people at outside picnic tables on Friday. There was some confusion and Sergeant Eismann reported to the place of business and explained that they are able to sell sealed to go drinks, but they are not able to allow customers to sit at the picnic tables and drink. Chief Knight is following up with the business owner today.
- There has been a lot of activity at City Parks and a number of Idaho residents monitoring whether or not Washington residents (or other out of state visitors) are using the parks. The PD and Parks Department are continuing to work with everyone on education. There are also a number of comments about Washington, Oregon and California plates at grocery stores. The Governor's order does not prohibit shopping at grocery stores. Also, if an out of state visitor is in Idaho, and is either here for essential travel or has been in state for 14 days, they are allowed to use the parks. I have attached Non-Resident Traveler's advisory document the City will be using to place on non-resident plated vehicles.
- The Finance Department has sent out 732 utility past due notices. This is 120 more than last month (last month was about average for the year). Department Heads will discuss how long the credit card fee will be waived and when hang tags and shut offs will start back up for the city.

- Total cases of COVID-19 in the Panhandle Health District area is 56, 52 KC and 4 BC. Press Release is attached.
- I have attached the flyer that the Sheriff Department is using when enforcing the out of state 14-day quarantine. Sheriff Wolfinger reported that they spent the weekend trying to enforce this order on “thousands” of visitors in Kootenai County.
- The Field Hospital that was delivered to Kootenai has been redeployed elsewhere, where there is more need for this type of facility. The Hospital had not been set up yet, due to lack of need at this time.
- Health Districts are working on guidance for businesses that are looking to re-open, especially with the anticipated relaxing of orders from Governor Little starting on May 1<sup>st</sup>. This includes discussion on Restaurants.
