# **COVID-19 Daily Briefing Report**

### **City of Post Falls Updates:**

- In looking at Phase 1- Post Falls City Hall will be opening to drop in customers starting May 4<sup>th</sup>. I have included an attached FAQ for customers. The City will continue to encourage customers to do business on-line as permitted. I will include protocols with my Friday Briefing. I have also attached a sign that will be posted on the City Hall doors. Kit will post notices of the opening and customer abilities for on-line services on Facebook and the webpage.

### Idaho State/Governor Little Updates:

- Stage 1 Protocols for Childcare, Places of Worship, and Youth Activities have been released and are attached.
- Idaho will be using Battelle to clean/sterilize PPE. They can process up to 80,000 masks per day and are offering this service for free to State Governments. This will help preserve PPE capacity and reduce overall costs. <u>https://www.battelle.org/inb/battelle-critical-care-decontamination-system-for-covid19</u>
- The biggest need for Idaho in PPE is surgical masks. They are continuing to work to fulfil this need. PPE Purchasing procedures are difficult to follow for Federal Guidelines. They are also discussing the process to eventually turn this back to the private side and how that might work if the State needed to bring it back during a surge period.
- Health Districts are placing more of a focus state-wider on contact tracing.
- The Governor will issue a "Stay Healthy" Order tomorrow vs. a Stay-At-Home order (current Stay-At-Home Order will be lifted). While the Governor requires legislative action to continue an Order past 60 days, there is no legislative action required to issue a new Order.
